ASSEMBLY AND INSTALLATION

- **NOTE:** The iPod® docks (NAID1B, NAID4B) are designed for use with 19" wide equipment racks. See the specific installation instructions provided with the rack for additional installation information.
- 1. Attach the dock (A) within the rack, using four 10-32 x 3/4" header point Phillips screws (not included). (See Figure 1)



- **NOTE:** Push iPod® dock drawer **IN** to both open and close drawer.
- 2. Plug iPod® into 30 pin connector in dock (A). (See Figure 2)
- Plug cables into appropriate connection point. (See Figure 2)
- **NOTE:** The iPod® may be charged through the USB jack on back of dock, or by using the USB power supply and adapter (B).




- 4. Fully extend drawer and leave it open. (See Figure 2)
- 5. Use cable tie loops (C) as desired for strain relief and to manage cables. (See Figure 2)

IMPORTANT ! : If cables are tied down while the drawer is shut, cables may be disconnected or damaged when drawer is opened! Make sure drawer is fully extended when securing cables in order to provide a proper length and unhindered operation.

6. Close drawer and complete the installation following the rack installation instructions.

Installing an IR Emitter (Optional)

- **NOTE:** For a discrete, clean look, a space was designed in front of the dock yet behind the IR window to allow for a third party IR emitter to be installed. Emitter wire may be routed along the side and out the back.
- 1. With drawer closed, remove iPod® dock from drawer. (See Figure 3)



4. Close drawer and reinstall iPod® dock to drawer. (See Figure 5)



- 2. Open drawer and install IR Emitter (not included) to front of drawer or on front of iPod® dock sensor as per IR Emitter's manufacturer's instructions. (See Figure 4)
- 3. Use cable ties (C) as desired to manage IR Emitter cable. (See Figure 4)


